DID YOU KNOW...X-Mas Waste To Produce Biofuel

Scientists at Imperial College, London have figured out that if all UK's discarded Christmas wrapping paper and cards were collected and fermented using micro-organisms, high grade biofuel could be produced to power motor vehicles. According to researchers, an estimated 1.5 Billion Christmas cards and 83 square kilometers of wrapping paper are dumped to the trash by UK residents every year. Some are recycled, but most end up in landfills. The scientists say, this amount of paper could provide upto 12 million litres of biofuel enough to run a bus for upto 18 million km.

In the case of add-ons like glitter and scotch tape on the Christmas cards and paper, the cellulose molecules in the tape would be broken down into glucose sugars and then fermented into ethanol fuel , just like the paper itself. Insoluble items like glitter are easy to filter out as part of the process. If this technology can be developed further, waste paper might ultimately provide a great environmentally friendly alternative to fossil fuels, the scientists claim.

GD – Demystified By Ms. Neenu Angelo



Group Discussions, endearingly termed GDs, have been continuing to play an essential part in job recruitments and admissions for professional educations since many years. Many candidates fail to make a mark in GDs mainly due to their wrong notions about it. There are a lot of myths regarding GDs and how to effectively tackle them.

Myth 1: GDs are an essential tool for selecting suitable candidates.

On the other hand, they are used for shortlisting candidates, in other words, for eliminating them.

Myth 2: The first one to talk will surely make it.

Wrong again! You need to talk first only if you are absolutely sure about the topic in hand and has a considerable knowledge about it. Otherwise, wait for a suitable opportunity.

Myth 3: The more you speak, the better your chances of making it.

The most common mistake candidates make! They talk and talk and do not let anyone else talk. Bad again! That gives a negative impression about you to the evaluator.

Myth 4: Pompous and high-sounding words make a great expression about you.

Be simple and straightforward. It is all about how well you can articulate your ideas in simple and clear language.

Myth 5: I spoke very less; I don't stand a chance.

You need to be a good listener to be a good participant in a GD. The key word is, be an active listener. But that doesn't mean you can forever be an active listener during the entire GD. Open your mouth when you think you have a valid point to make.

Myth 6: I should talk only when I am asked to.

Don't wait and wait for a proper opportunity to talk or till someone asks you to speak. It is completely your call. Grab the best opportunity to talk when you have something valid to say. At least, be a good listener throughout and grab the opportunity to provide a conclusion to the discussion.

Myth 7: I should have aggressive body language to gain attention.

This is where most participants fail. You should have a pleasant and warm body language and suitable gestures. A warm and friendly attitude always helps. Your expressions, body language, posture and tone of voice speak volumes about you.

Myth 8: I should always agree to the topic.

When a topic is given to you, you can either agree with it or disagree with it. Unlike a debate, you can even point out the two sides of the same coin.

Myth 9: I should make others agree to my point.

That is a very bad thing to do! You just need to express your point of view and have a positive mentality towards what others in your group have to say. Even when a group member disagrees with you, be patient with him and accept his point of view. When you need to disagree with someone, do that most politely.

- Intervene if the discussion is turning out to be hostile. It reflects your leadership.
- Speak to-the-point, without repeating.
- Encourage a silent member to contribute.
- Back your points with examples, incidents or facts and figures.
- Maintain eye contact with participants, and not with the evaluator.
- Be gentle with your presentation.
- Be natural, calm and maintain composure.
- Think before you speak.
- Strive towards a proper conclusion for your discussion.

- Don't be loud or aggressive.
- Do not go overboard with enthusiasm if you are familiar with the topic.
- Do not interrupt others.
- Do not ask irrelevant questions.
- Never laugh at anyone's opinion.
- Do not try to formulate your next comment while someone is still presenting his input. Instead, listen!
- Remember that GD is an effective tool in problem solving, decision making and personality assessment. Know how to speak with confidence, how to exhibit leadership skills and how to make the group achieve the goal.



Story of "The Valentines Day

"The story of Valentine's Day begins in the third century with an oppressive Roman emperor and a humble Christian Martyr. The emperor was Claudius II. The Christian was Valentinus.

Claudius had ordered all Romans to worship twelve gods, and had made it a crime punishable by death to associate with Christians. But Valentinus was dedicated to the ideals of Christ; not even the threat of death could keep him from practicing his beliefs. He was arrested and imprisoned.

During the last weeks of Valentinus's life a remarkable thing happened. Seeing that he was a man of learning, the jailer asked whether his daughter, Julia, might be brought to Valentinus for lessons.
